#### ASSESSMENT POLICY APPLICABLE FOR GRADES XI AND XII

This Assessment Policy will remain in effect for the 2025-2026 academic session until the Senior Secondary Curriculum is released or until CBSE issues further circulars relevant to this area. Amendments and edits will be done based on new information.

XI and XII is a composite course.

- Students will choose a minimum of 5 subjects in class XI which they will continue in class XII.
- Schools will offer subjects with no segregation of streams. For example, (Physics, Mathematics, History, Psychology, English Core) or (Business Studies, Psychology, Hindi Core, Physical Education, Chemistry) are valid combinations.
- Schools will offer combinations based on the availability of faculty/ rooms and with proper **counseling** regarding future career prospects but with no hard divisions between subjects traditionally thought to be under Commerce/ Science/ Humanities.
